University H Courses for 2021

The H course context is changing from 2021.

Rule Changes

The significant rule changes beginning with Year 11 students in 2021 are summarised as follows:

- 1. H courses are limited to a minor.
- 2. Students may complete two H courses only.
- 3. H course units cannot be combined and/or meshed into courses delivered in the home college.
- 4. H courses will be assessed under the BSSS course Frameworks using the Achievement Standards of the given Framework, including separate Years 11 and 12 Achievement Standards.
- 5. Students currently engaged in a H course will see out the H course under existing rules.

Students will continue to receive a university grade in addition to the BSSS grade. Students will continue to gain access to university credit or entry schemes as seems appropriate to the university.

University of Canberra H Courses

The University of Canberra have launched H courses. These will deliver first year courses true to content, where subject to University requirements, successful completion will provide credit to students who enter a UC program after college.

- Understanding People and Behaviour (Psychology)
- Business Decision Making
- Systemic Anatomy and Physiology
- Introduction to Information Technology.

ANU H Courses

ANU has launched several new H courses:

- Global Perspectives on Commerce: for students from any Commerce major
- Creative Computing: combining Fine Arts/Music and IT
- Korean Culture and Language: does not require Korean studies in the home college.

The Music H course at ANU will not continue.

CIT

CIT has introduced a Music competency based VET program for senior secondary students that can be considered for inclusion in the senior secondary certificate as an E course.
