Connected Learning Course for 2021

Key Points

- The *Connected Learning A/M* 2021-2022 course will be available for delivery in 2021.
- The *Connected Learning A/M* course combines elements from the current *Connected Learning* and *Food for Life* courses.
- *Connected Learning* 2021-2022 provides students with opportunities to find and assess information about living well, and to develop skills and knowledge that enable a balanced, meaningful, and independent life.

Teachers will need to:

1. **Review the course and develop Programs of Learning, to include the content of the new course**
2. **Develop assessment tasks that reflect requirements outlined in the new course and the *Integrated Learning Framework***
3. **Create new rubrics for each assessment task, using the new and separate Achievement Standards for Years 11 and 12.**

Writing a Program of Learning Online Course
